Young Writer Categories

Junior Writers – PROSE & POETRY

Open to young people in school year levels 7–9, who live or attend school in the City of Boroondara.

Prose length: Between 500 – 900 words

Poetry: Must be less than 200 lines

Senior Writers – PROSE & POETRY

Open to young people in school year levels 10–12 (or if not at secondary school, 15–18 years of age as at 27 August 2011), who live, work or attend school in the City of Boroondara.

Prose length: Between 900–1300 words

Poetry: Must be less than 200 lines
