

## Objection to a Planning Permit Application

Your response will be made available for public viewing and copies may be given to interested parties for the purpose of enabling consideration and review as part of the planning process under the *Planning and Environment Act 1987*.

Please read the notes below regarding the privacy statement before completing this form.

Any person who may be affected by the granting of a permit may object.

- If you object the Council must consider the objection unless you withdraw it.
- If you object you must state the reasons why and say how you would be affected by the grant of a permit.
- The Council may reject an objection that it considers has been made primarily to secure or maintain a direct or indirect commercial advantage for the objector.
- The Council will not decide on the application until after the latest date shown on either the notice you received or on the notice in a newspaper or on the site.
- If you object you will be notified in writing of the Council's decision. If you have listed an email address you will be notified by email.
- If you object and you are not satisfied with the Council's decision you may appeal within 28 days of the notice of the decision to the Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal
