The late Mary Drost OAM, resident of Camberwell, is a name etched into Boroondara's foundations. Mary was a multi-faceted person, a genteel lady with a backbone of steel. She has been described as both a joyful, generous, animated woman of deep faith, and a fierce crusader for planning, environment and heritage causes. Mary understood the importance of preserving heritage in both built form and social context – a message she took regularly to local and Victorian Government officials for more than 30 years.

Most of our local community identified her as the founder of the Boroondara Residents Action Group established in 2004, and as a passionate pro-heritage advocate.

Mary was a councillor for the City of Camberwell, 1982-85, and on many occasions since has presented to the Council chamber in support of heritage preservation. She would look us all in the eye and remind us that the baton was now in our hands and we needed to take heritage responsibilities very seriously. A message I personally do heed.

Vale Mary Drost: advocate for our community

Former City of Camberwell councillor and heritage and community advocate Mary Drost OAM has passed away at the age of 92.

A proud Boroondara resident, she served as a City of Camberwell councillor from 1982 to 1985, advocating for the protection of Boroondara's built heritage and streetscapes. In 2004, Mary formed the Boroondara Residents Action Group (BRAG), committed to protecting 'heritage, open green spaces and democratic community rights'.

One of her better-known BRAG campaigns protested plans to redevelop Camberwell Railway Station. She was famously supported by actor and then Camberwell resident Geoffrey Rush, and comedian Barry Humphries who was brought up in the suburb.

Mary later widened her focus to form Planning Backlash (now Planning Democracy), a network of resident action groups throughout Melbourne and Victoria. She attended the Victorian Parliament and Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal, organised street marches, wrote submissions to government, and petitioned planning ministers. She also attended City of Boroondara council and planning committee meetings until as recently as last year.

On 26 January we gathered at Hawthorn Arts Centre to celebrate the 2024 Boroondara Citizen of the Year awards.

Henry Shirrefs was named Boroondara Young Citizen of the Year, alongside Brenton Ponza, who was named Citizen of the Year.

A Junction Ward local, Henry is an exceptional leader and community volunteer. At 18, he has led initiatives across sustainability, environment and mental health. His efforts include setting up an interschool sustainability partnership as well as helping raise more than \$47,000 for Lifeline.

Henry says there is nothing stopping other young people in Boroondara from getting out there and bringing their ideas to life.

'Your vision, passion and unique perspective have the potential to make a real difference,' he says. 'Don't underestimate the impact of individual actions – even the smallest ideas can lead to significant positive change.' For those just starting out and thinking about an idea that might benefit the community, Henry says 'go for it!'.

'Start by sharing your idea with others, seek feedback, and build a network of support. Nothing gets solved by one person, and everyone has a perspective that's worth hearing, so talk about your idea to lots of different people to broaden your understanding.'

Henry says the next step is to come up with a plan and follow it through. 'And of course, have fun doing it so you'll want to keep going,' says Henry.

The annual Boroondara Citizen of the Year Awards recognise people who have made an exceptional contribution to our community through leadership or commitment to improving the lives of others. Nominations for the 2025 Boroondara Citizen of the Year Awards will open in September.

This plan is our guide for transforming Camberwell Junction into a vibrant, inspiring and community-focused place. It covers both private development proposals and public upgrades.

The plan has actions for how to deliver the community's vision for the centre in the 6 priority areas:

- Thriving economy
- Sustainable living
- Built form
- Public realm
- Access and movement
- Community wellbeing

Following the adoption, we'll be preparing updates to include the land use and built form parts of the plan in Boroondara's planning controls.

We'll check back with the community when delivering large-scale upgrades to the area.

We started this work back in 2021 with extensive research then sought community feedback over 3 rounds of face-to-face and online engagement.

He quickly excelled and was soon showcasing his hockey skills at state level with Victoria's Under 21 team and in the Australian Under 21 team, the Burras. Liam was chosen to captain the Burras team that played the Netherlands. His nominator said Liam's hockey skills were complemented by natural leadership qualities, dedication, discipline and perseverance.

Terry Ryan was recognised with a Lifetime Achievement Award at last

year's event. Terry has been involved in every area of Camberwell Hockey Club with one exception - he has never played hockey. Terry came to the club in 1984 when his son Ben started in the beginners' program. His nominator said that from that moment Terry was 'hooked'. He was Club President from 2001 to 2007 and took roles including Junior Section Chair, team manager, committee member and ground maintenance supervisor. Terry currently manages the top women's team and provides mentorship and counsel to many club members. He is a Life Member of both Hockey Victoria and Camberwell Hockey Club.
