The Boroondara Community Plan is the 'master plan' that underpins Council's strategy. I encourage you to participate in the community consultation process. It's really important we have your input and feedback.

Shaping the future of Boroondara

The Boroondara Community Plan sets out a ten-year vision for the future, guiding our decision making to ensure we deliver what you told us is most important.

We heard from more than 4700 community members during our stage one Boroondara Community Plan consultation, including many from Junction Ward:

- 383 from Hawthorn East
- 655 from Hawthorn
- 657 from Camberwell
- 252 from Canterbury.

Stage 2 is now underway, with a series of 'Boroondara Conversations' workshops bringing together community members from diverse backgrounds, age groups and suburbs to discuss the ways we can work together to deliver on our community priorities.

The workshops build on the findings of stage one and will help us make sure the Boroondara Community Plan continues to meet the needs and aspirations of those who live, work and study here.

You will have an opportunity to review the Boroondara Community Plan when it is presented for public exhibition in August/ September this year, before it is formally presented to Council in October 2021.

Camberwell Community Centre update

Construction is 80 per cent finished at the brand new Camberwell Community Centre, with works due for completion late March and programming set to begin in the new building in April.

The newly upgraded centre caters for school-aged children right through to adults, with the larger building configured to house the centre's many services and activities.

The South Camberwell Maternal and Child Health Centre is also operating from the new building located at Fairholm Grove.

Executive officer of Camberwell Community Centre, Liz Finucan, said: "We're delighted by the upgrade. Camberwell Community Centre classes, programs and activities will be operating under the one roof for the first time in many years.

"The new Centre with its hall, art studios, ceramics space and modern meeting rooms will bring a new dimension to Fairholm Grove and another level of community engagement to the residents of Boroondara."

The local community is invited to join us for Open House Week at Camberwell Community Centre – a series of free events starting on Tuesday 27 April. Participate in taster classes, centre tours, artist talks and other activities. Events are free and registrations are essential.

It's wonderful to see people back in the Camberwell Library, enjoying the wide variety of resources on offer.

We know our libraries provide a valuable and important service for our community. Although we closed the doors for a significant period during Victoria's COVID-19 lockdowns, our librarians rallied, providing home delivery services, book collection (when allowed) and answering questions online and over the phone. During this time, more than 110,000 items were loaned to members, and we expanded our ebooks, eaudio, emagazines and online resources.

Camberwell Library is now back to pre-lockdown capacity. Our library staff are thrilled to welcome familiar and new members, and to see the return of friendly chatter and learning and reading.
