A huge thank you to the 4000+ people who responded to refreshing the Boroondara Community Plan. This strategic document guides us now and into the future. While planning for the future is obviously complex, revisiting the Plan helps monitor whether or not we're on the right track.

Although we had to delay the official opening, I'm delighted to see the new Camberwell Community Centre operational. If you aren't aware of what our Community Centres provide, please come and have a look. There are 11 Neighbourhood Houses and Community Centres in our municipality, each with an impressive range of activities and opportunities available.

We had a full (allowable numbers) audience for the First Year celebration of the introduction of FOGO. Costa Georgiadis was a very entertaining, knowledgeable guest speaker, as were the local families who shared their advice and stories. Embracing this system has reduced our landfill by about 70 per cent.

Preserving our local heritage is something I believe we must maintain an active stance on. Council has done much in the way of preservation, including the recent formation of a Heritage Advisory Committee, which I currently Chair. While it's pleasing to see the work that's been conducted on Heritage Gap Studies, we acknowledge there is more to be done. Looking at any society we can see how the preservation of historical structures represents the stories and identity of its people.

The civic precinct has been the home to Council services since the late 1800s, and has been redeveloped over time to better serve the Boroondara community. Today it is Council's head office, incorporating the Council Chamber, Camberwell Library and community function rooms.

FOGO anniversary celebrations with Costa Georgiadis

On Saturday 22 May, more than 300 members of our community came together at Camberwell Primary School for a special celebration event to mark the one-year anniversary and success of Boroondara's Food Organics and Garden Organics (FOGO) service.

Guest speaker, Costa Georgiadis from the ABC's Gardening Australia program, spoke about the importance of the FOGO service, and the positive impact it is having and can continue to have if we all use the service correctly.

Since FOGO was introduced in May 2020, we've seen around 200 tonnes of food and garden waste being redirected into FOGO bins each week. Waste that would have otherwise previously gone to landfill, causing harmful greenhouse gas emissions.

In total, our waste crew are now collecting more than 600 tonnes of FOGO material weekly – the equivalent to 35 large full waste trucks – which is

sent off to be composted for use across agriculture and horticulture businesses to grow more food.

The introduction of FOGO was the biggest change to Council's waste service in more than 30 years, and we appreciate the support you've shown while we transitioned to this new service model.

Our community has embraced the change and we now have almost 50,000 households using the service.

Having already rolled out FOGO to houses and townhouses, we are currently finalising the roll-out across larger unit and apartment complexes with Council bin collections.


