Path upgrade for Fordham Gardens

Lynden Ward locals have improved and new-look paths to enjoy at Fordham Gardens.

The path network has been increased to at least two metres wide, with new concrete edging that replicates the historical path to maintain the heritage look and feel of these formal gardens, while also improving pedestrian function and flow.

A new path has also been added leading to the barbecue and picnic tables to improve access and overall enjoyment of these beautiful gardens.

Council nominated this project for funding support after receiving community feedback on the need to improve the path network, including better drainage to prevent water ponding over the path.

With support from the Australian Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program, a \$500,000 grant was recently awarded to make the Fordham Gardens improvements.

Highfield Road Shopping Centre improvements

Council recently completed some exciting upgrade works to the Highfield Road Shopping Centre in Camberwell as part of our Shopping Centre Improvement Plan. The new centre was finished in June, with a design based on the ideas and feedback we received from the community.

Our shopping villages and strips contribute to the local economy and the vibrant atmosphere of our city. The improvement works sought to enhance the appearance and character of the Highfield Road Shopping Centre and create an attractive, pedestrian-friendly space where people want to shop, relax and spend more time. The revitalised centre includes public spaces for relaxing and outdoor eating, creating opportunities for longer stays. Additional plantings have been provided to enhance the green, leafy character and streetscape appearance, while also offering more shade. We have also improved pedestrian amenity and access with new footpaths and street furniture.

The improvements also support local businesses by creating a more attractive space for residents and visitors to spend more time in and enjoy.



Local business spotlight: Three generations of Monacos

When Rosario and Angela Rosa Monaco opened Monaco's Continental Delicatessen and Food Store at 525 Camberwell Road in 1974, it was the beginning of a Boroondara family enterprise that would be built through hard work, long hours, and a strong desire to build a future for their young family.

From a single store, the Monacos expanded into the next-door premises in 2007, and the eye-catching doublefronted shopfront with its hand-written blackboard signs, massive displays of Parmigiano-Reggiano, Grana Padano and provolone, plus rows of shelves stacked with produce emphasising the family's Italian and Calabrian heritage, is now a local shopping icon.

Many locals love to stop for an espresso before or after shopping - perhaps accompanied by a panino stuffed with polpette or cotoletta.

"We were one of the first places in the area where customers could buy an espresso or take-away cappuccino or caffe latte after they finished shopping," said Robert Monaco, son of Rosario and Angela Rosa.

Almost 50 years after it first opened, Robert and his brother Domenic now run Monaco's, building on their parents' dream and the contributions of their sisters Maria, Josephine and Antonia, and encouraging the third generation of Monacos who also love to work in the store.

"Rosario started out selling goods from his station wagon, on top of his job at General Motors Holden, before he opened Monaco's," said Robert.

"The business we have today is all because of his and Angela Rosa's hard work. We hope we continue to make them proud."
