The Boroondara City Council has prepared Amendment C353boro to the Boroondara Planning Scheme.

The land affected by the amendment is:

- 26 Goldthorns Avenue, Kew
- 3-5 Florence Avenue, Kew
- 33 Thornton Street, Kew; and
- 97 Argyle Street, Kew.

The amendment proposes to apply the Heritage Overlay to three individually significant heritage places (26 Goldthorns Avenue, Kew, 3-5 Florence Avenue, Kew and 97 Argyle Street, Kew) and regrade 33 Thornton Avenue, Kew from a non-contributory to contributory place in the Thornton Estate Residential Precinct (HO806).
