

Street party permit conditions

The following conditions apply to all street parties held in the City of Boroondara.

- a. A street party is classified as a private event and is covered under Council's Public Liability Insurance Policy. A street party will only be conducted by residential properties.
- b. Council's Public Liability Insurance Policy does not include claims arising from:
 - Use of security personnel.
 - Children's rides.
 - Animal rides.
 - Amusement rides and devices.
 - Inflatable recreational equipment.
 - Jumping castles.
 - Use of children's toys and second hand electrical items and tools.

Should any of the above items be required, the street party organiser is required to arrange their own Public Liability Insurance Policy.

The following activities are not permitted:

- Fireworks/ Pyrotechnics.
 - Rock / Pop concerts.
 - Sports or games with a high risk of injury or damage.
 - Any advertisement displayed to invite non-residents of the street to attend the event.
- c. The street party organiser is responsible for ensuring the consumption of any alcohol within the road reserve shall comply with the relevant laws. The road reserve includes footpath, nature strip and road.
 - d. Street parties will be permitted until 9pm.
 - e. The street party must be a single day event and can run for no more than six hours.
 - f. The maximum length of a road closure associated with a street party is generally 200 metres and should be between intersections. Variations may apply depending on the street network.
 - g. The street or section of street to be closed must have an average daily traffic volume of less than 2,000 vehicles per day.
 - h. Normal pedestrian usage of the street is to be retained while the street party is in progress.
 - i. The street party organiser is responsible for the immediate removal of all barricades to permit emergency vehicle access into the closed street.
 - j. The street party organiser is responsible for ensuring the event complies with all Local Laws and necessary permits.

- k. The sale of food, drink (including alcohol), prohibited substances or other articles is not permitted on the road reserve. The road reserve includes footpath, nature strip and road.
- l. The street party organiser is responsible for ensuring all participants are respectful of the amenity of surrounding residents in relation to noise, behaviour and parking.
- m. Noise must be kept to a reasonable level so as not to cause an annoyance to other persons.
- n. The street must be left in a clean and tidy state and no damage shall be caused to any assets located within the road reserve.
- o. Council reserves the right to revoke the street party permit at any time.
