The playground was opened in 1998 as one of the first inclusive playgrounds in Australia – a trailblazer for its time. Inclusion and 'side-by-side' play for children of all abilities was and remains the main goal for this playground.

We recognise the strong sentimental connection our community has with this popular play space and want to ensure this remains for many years to come.

Across January and February 2022, we sought community feedback to help us better understand what you love most about the playground, and where we may be able to make further improvements as part of the renewal process.

Kew Recreation Centre is coming along swimmingly

Major development works for the transformation of the Kew Recreation Centre are well on track for a mid-2023 completion and the appointed builder, ADCO Constructions, is making steady progress.

Since late last year the tower crane has been in operation, delivering materials around the site and enabling the builders to begin the pool structures, including the learn-toswim pool. The base of the 25-metre pool has now been poured and development of the 2 indoor sports courts is also progressing well.

Steel structural works are underway, and the community can start to see the new Kew Recreation Centre really taking shape. Roof works will commence in mid to late-2022. Council is very pleased with the progress of the project.

Freeway Golf Course bunkers an Australian first

Construction works to redevelop our Freeway Golf Course are progressing well, with the course on track to re-open in late-2022.

In recent months construction of new timber-faced sand bunkers has begun - the first time this type of bunker has been built at an Australian golf course.

Timber-faced bunkers have been used on traditional-style golf courses in the United Kingdom for some time, and are known for their practical value, unique feel and visual amenity.

Council's golf-course architect, Pacific Coast Design, recommended the inclusion during the redesign process after successfully using this bunker design at golf courses in China, Thailand and India.

While most golf courses have sand bunkers, the style and construction of these can result in high maintenance costs. Much bunker maintenance is focused on the 'face' of the bunker (the slope from base of bunker to top), which often washes out into the base during heavy rain and needs to be reinstated. The timber face will reduce maintenance time and cost.

Golf balls also often plug into the face of sand bunkers, causing angst for golfers, and requiring hand preparation and maintenance to encourage the golf balls to move down to the sand base. With the timber face in place, the golf ball naturally bounces down to the base, for a more enjoyable golfing experience.
