

Out of the community engagement stage, we will develop long and short-term plans to enhance the precinct, albeit now without the grant funding for the Junction West car park and associated trafficmanagement measures. So, while some things have to go back to the drawing board, we are still working on plans that can add appeal, improve function and accessibility, and preserve local heritage. Celebrating our market value


Junction Ward is home to 2 much-loved markets that have been serving the local community for decades – the Camberwell Fresh Food Market since the 1930s, and the Camberwell Sunday Market since the 1970s. Whether you live locally or are new to the area, take some time to explore them.

The Camberwell Fresh Food Market offers all the fresh ingredients you'll ever need, including fruit and vegies, fish, poultry, meat, nuts, gourmet dog treats and flowers, along with delicatessens brimming with cheeses, antipasto, dips, breads and pastries. Here, you can also grab a coffee or lunch and relax outdoors in the shade of our verdant plaza spaces.

The iconic Camberwell Sunday Market is a Melbourne institution selling vintage items, collectibles, second-hand and hand-made goods – everything from '80s LPs to mid-century knick-knacks and fashion, alongside food vans and buskers.

Shopping at the Camberwell Sunday Market comes with the bonus of doing a little good on the side, as your gold-coin donation entry fee collected by volunteers from Balwyn Rotary is funnelled into multiple charitable projects, including our via our own Boroondara Community Strengthening Grants.

Kickstart your project with a Community Strengthening Grant

After a challenging 2 years due to the COVID-19 pandemic, providing financial support to community organisations, clubs and not-for-profits through our Annual Community Strengthening Grants program has never been more important.

These grants contribute funding to support the delivery of projects, activities and initiatives that strengthen our community.

Applications for the next round of Annual Community Strengthening Grants open in late-April. So, we're encouraging local organisations with ideas to help our community bounce back to come forward and apply for grants of up to \$10,000.

Victorian YMCA Community Programming – Junction Skate was awarded \$2,600 in grant funding to support the launch of its Girl Skate learn-to-skate program. This grant will allow YMCA to give community members free access for the first 12 weeks, offering female-only programming right here in Junction Ward at the Junction Skate and BMX Park.

The grant will create more opportunities for participation for female and LGBTIQ+ people in the community via skateboarding.

We are here to help give your grant application the best chance of success. Applicants can discuss their ideas with a Council officer and attend one of our grant-writing help sessions.
