

Renewing Fordham Avenue Kindergarten

We are planning for our community's future by renewing Fordham Avenue Kindergarten during the April school holidays.

This project is part of Council's continued plans to deliver high-quality facilities for families and better meet the needs of more than 80 children and staff

Established in 1940, Fordham Avenue Kindergarten is a local landmark and has been serving generations of families for over 80 years.

The renewal will include new bathrooms. lighting and window upgrades, and improved access to children's spaces. The works will help create a refreshed learning environment for kindergarten groups and new modern preparation spaces for educators.

Construction will be carried out in the school holidays to avoid any disruption to programs, activities and services.

Kickstart your project with a Council community grant

After a challenging 2 years due to the COVID-19 pandemic, providing financial support to community organisations, clubs and not-for-profits through our Annual Community Strengthening Grants program has never been more important.

These grants contribute funding to support the delivery of projects, activities and initiatives that strengthen our community.

Applications for the next round of Annual Community Strengthening Grants open in late-April. So, we are encouraging local organisations with ideas to help our community bounce back to come forward and apply for grants of up to \$10,000.

In the previous round, Surrey Hills Neighbourhood Centre received \$9,250 to support the delivery of a placemaking initiative locally at Lynden Park Reserve.

Funding will allow Surrey Hills Neighbourhood Centre to develop and implement a community engagement strategy including events for the community, such as demonstrations, trial classes, and open days where staff will survey the community about what types of future activities they would like to see offered.

The findings will support the local community to connect and collectively imagine how the Lynden Park Recreation Facility could be further used to increase social connections, provide opportunities for lifelong learning, and support a healthy community.

We are here to help give your grant application the best chance of success. Applicants can discuss their ideas with a Council officer and attend one of our grant-writing help sessions.

Lynden Park pavilion set for renewal

The Lynden Park pavilion is scheduled for renewal in 2023-24. This planned renewal is in line with Council's Development and Funding of Community Pavilions – Sport and Recreation Policy, and the Boroondara Community Plan 2021-31.

Upgrades to the current pavilion will address the requirements of sporting clubs and potentially other community groups, and will provide exciting, vibrant and flexible spaces and facilities to support the needs of the surrounding community.

In the past 11 years, our program has exhibited more than 2,050 artworks produced by more than 470 local artists, showcasing the diversity and depth of creative talent in Boroondara. More than 1,000 people attend exhibition openings annually, and each exhibition attracts around 800 visits on average.

The Community Exhibitions Program has also helped facilitate art sales worth more than \$98,000 – funds that go straight back into the pockets of the local artists exhibited.

We are proud to offer this program each year to help foster a thriving arts scene in Boroondara.
