Council's Climate Action Plan (CAP) outlines how we will respond to the increasing threat of climate change to our environment, and work with you - our community - to keep reducing our city's environmental footprint. To deliver on one of the many actions in the CAP, we've partnered with Solar Savers to implement a community bulk-buy solar program.

The local government-developed program will help our community access affordable, high-quality solar power. Installing rooftop solar can reduce your environmental impact, cut your energy bills, and give you greater peace of mind against future electricity price rises.

Another CAP action is to improve our local habitat for biodiversity, and this autumn Hawthorn residents have a local opportunity to do just that through our Backyard Biodiversity program (www.boroondara.vic.gov.au/ backyard-biodiversity).

Our Hawthorn Stepping Stone corridor provides an important habitat link for local wildlife. By taking part in the program, you can help local birds and other wildlife flourish in the Hawthorn area.

The project will support you to enhance your garden to provide habitat that helps native animals thrive, through workshops, landscape gardening advice and free indigenous tubestock plants. The workshops will run from late-April to June.

Registrations to participate in the program close on Friday 22 April.

# Kickstart your project with a Council community grant

After a challenging two years due to the COVID-19 pandemic, providing financial support to community organisations, clubs and not-for-profits through our Annual Community Strengthening Grants program has never been more important.

These grants contribute funding to support the delivery of projects, activities and initiatives that strengthen our community.

Applications for the next round of Annual Community Strengthening Grants open in late-April. So, we're encouraging local organisations with ideas to help our community bounce back to come forward and apply for grants of up to \$10,000.

In the previous round, the Melbourne Hindustani Classical Music Society was awarded a \$6,889 grant to support the delivery of the Melbourne International Festival of Hindustani Classical Music here in Riversdale Ward.

Building on the success of the 2020 festival, this grant funding will enable the event to proceed in 2022 by providing financial support for venue hire at Hawthorn Arts Centre, printing and advertising, musician fees and catering.

### Bills Street works underway

Preliminary works are underway for the Victorian Government's redevelopment at 1-12 Bills Street, Hawthorn, bringing some temporary changes to parking in the area.

The Bills Street redevelopment will construct 6 buildings on the site, ranging from 3 to 7 storeys, to accommodate 206 homes. To replace the existing car park at Robinson Road, a new public car park will be built at Patterson Reserve which will increase parking from 39 bays to 48.

#### Access to Robinson Road car park

Construction of the new car park is planned for completion later this year. During construction, temporary public parking has been made available at the nearby University of Melbourne campus.

Carpark access changes include:

- No standing/parking in Robinson Road. This will become a drop-off area only, with the exception of 2 accessible car-parking spaces.
- 40 public parking spaces are now available at the University of Melbourne campus.
- On weekdays 13 of the 40 spaces are for public parking only and not to be used by contractors. On weekends, all 40 spaces are for public parking only; contractor parking is prohibited.
- Safe pedestrian access will be available along the east side of Robinson Road.
