

Landmark buildings open their doors

We are opening the doors to some of Boroondara's landmark buildings for Open House Melbourne weekend at the end of this month.

Held on the last weekend of July, this is your chance to step inside some of our most significant buildings, including 2 on your doorstep in Studley Ward.

- Uncover the history of Kew Court
 House, the longest-serving police
 station in Victoria until its closure in
 1990. Discover the jail cells and learn
 how the building was reshaped to
 become a community hub for Kew
 and surrounding areas.
- Visit the magnificent 1880 Italianate mansion Villa Alba. Overlooking the Yarra at Studley Park, the mansion, now a museum, houses one of the most important examples of late-19th-century decoration in Australia. Villa Alba features rare hand-painted, stencilled, and gilded decoration by Scottish-trained interior designers the Paterson Brothers.

The threads and fruits of kindness

This year, we are celebrating the 30-year anniversary of the Boroondara Volunteer Resource Centre – a remarkable milestone.

Boroondara has one of the strongest rates of volunteering in Melbourne, with more than a quarter of residents donating their time. Our volunteers play a vital role in our community, with many Council programs and initiatives relying on their assistance.

Judith Scurfield is a long-time volunteer at Kew Neighbourhood Learning Centre (KNLC). She initially came for yoga classes, then later, gardening and the Be Connected upskilling program.

Gardening led her to join the Fruit Squad, a group of volunteers who harvested fruit from trees in the gardens of people who could not do this themselves. The produce was shared between them and the Sparechair Cafe, the social enterprise cafe at KNLC.

"We learnt some new skills like making marmalade and preserving lemons. The squad has not continued, but a small group of volunteers, including me, is still needed each summer to water KNLC's productive vegetable garden in January, when the centre is closed," says Judith.

Her latest volunteering effort sees her involved in Threads of Kindness – a group making quilts and doona covers for women leaving refuges where they have been living to escape family violence.

The project has financial support from the Sidney Myer Fund and the material is donated by Highly Sprung Furniture in High Street, Kew. The "beautiful" fabric can be made by the volunteers into bed covers, bags, heat packs and other gifts.

"What is not given as individual gifts may be sold as fund-raisers on market days at KNLC. It is a very worthwhile project and gives all of us a great deal of pleasure," says Judith.

Playground improvements

There are exciting new playgrounds on their way for Studley ward.

Works to deliver the new Victoria Park Regional Playground started in February and are expected to be completed by late-2022.

This new playground has been shaped by 2 rounds of community consultation to create a fun and inclusive design. Play equipment will include an accessible flying fox, Ninja Warrior-style elements and a sensory nature trail.

The Victoria Park Regional Playground is supported by the Victorian Government through the Suburban Parks Program.

We are also upgrading the playground at Kate Campbell Reserve to improve the play experience for all children. During May and June, we sought community feedback on a draft design. This feedback will help inform the final design for the new playground.

Construction works on Walmer Street Bridge set to begin

The Walmer Street Bridge crosses the Yarra River between Kew and Richmond/Abbotsford. It plays an important role for pedestrians and in the regional bicycle network, providing connections into the Melbourne central business district.

The bridge comprises 3 key sections, including the southern land bridge (owned and managed by the City of Yarra), the river bridge (a heritage-listed Victorian Government asset), and the northern land bridge (owned and managed by the City of Boroondara).

The northern land bridge section of the Walmer Street Bridge in Kew has been in poor condition for some time and must be replaced.

Supported by funding from the Australian Government, Council awarded the tender for contract in April 2022 and works are expected to begin in mid to late-2022. The redevelopment of this section of Walmer Street Bridge will ensure it becomes wider, safer and

enhanced for those who use it. now and into the future.

Key features include increasing the width from 1.7m to 3.6m to offer a safer shared path for pedestrians and cyclists, decreasing its steepness so the bridge complies with Disability Discrimination Act requirements, structurally improving the bridge and the staircase connection to the riverbank, adding handrail lighting, and improving its overall amenity.

While construction works take place, the full length of the Walmer Street Bridge will be closed for about 8 months.

We encourage cyclists and pedestrians who regularly use the bridge to consider alternative routes or modes of transport during this time.
