

As many of you will already know, especially if you have children or grandchildren, the rocket has returned to Central Gardens, and since its return has been a very popular destination. Removal of the Ferguson Stand, at the south-western corner of Glenferrie Oval, has moved one step closer with the closing of tenders for its demolition. Once removed, the oval will be linked by green open space to the seldom-visited treed open space beyond, then on to Grace Park.

For those of us who are concerned about our environment, progress on Boroondara's Climate Action Plan is indeed a present. In this newsletter we provide an update but, as 98 to 99% of our municipal emissions are generated by we, the residents, like many others I am putting my money where my convictions are and investing to reduce my carbon footprint.

After a long wait, our fully electric car arrived in October. This is being charged primarily from solar panels on our roof, arranged through Council's sponsored Solar Savers scheme. We are gradually working our way towards an all-electric house, powered from renewable sources, of course – a small gift to our environment.

Top tips to reduce your waste

Everyone has an important role to play in reducing waste sent to landfill. Here are some tips to help you reduce, reuse and recycle more:



Before buying something new, consider whether you could borrow or rent the items instead.



Consider buying second-hand. You can also sell, share, swap or donate unwanted items to stop them going to landfill.



Remember to bring your reusable bags, coffee cups, water bottles and cutlery when heading out.



We can't always avoid creating waste, so try to choose products in recyclable packaging.



Before disposing of broken or damaged items, including furniture, electrical goods or clothing, see if they can be fixed. You could take them to the North Balwyn Repair Cafe at the Greythorn Community Hub, which operates on the third Sunday of every month, from February to November.



Always place loose recyclable items in your yellow-lidded recycling bin.

Working together to deliver on our Climate Action Plan

It has been a year since Boroondara's Climate Action Plan was adopted by Council and launched to help deliver what you have told us is important to our community.

Over the past year, we've implemented and achieved several actions with our community to respond to environmental sustainability and tackle climate change together. These include:

- buying green electricity for Council's small sites, so that all Council electricity is now renewable
- holding a Sustainable Living
 Festival in November to engage with
 the community and offer advice about
 practical steps to live more sustainably
- releasing the Boroondara Bicycle Strategy to set a framework for advancing cycling infrastructure across our municipality

running the Backyard Biodiversity
Project, which supported residents
in learning how to help local birds
and wildlife journey safely through
Hawthorn to local creeks and
the Yarra River.

Many more actions will be coming up over the next year, including the development of a Circular Economy Strategy, an Urban Greening Strategy including assessment of the performance of our trees, and renewal and planting of 1,000 street trees each year.

Here in Glenferrie Ward, electric-vehicle chargers will be installed in the car park beside the Hawthorn Aquatic and Leisure Centre next year. This will include one dual-port charger, and one Australianmade dual-port fast charger, encouraging uptake of low-emission vehicles and helping to make Glenferrie Road shopping strip a destination of choice.

Council also launched the Solar Savers program earlier this year for homes and businesses in Boroondara, and due to its success has extended the program into 2023.

The local-government program has given community members advice about solar power, and supported them in getting affordable, quality rooftop solar. This can help cut energy bills, reduce environmental impact, and give greater peace of mind against future power price rises.

Revitalised Rocket Park takes off

It has been a pleasure to welcome our community back to the new space-themed playground at Central Gardens, Hawthorn. After construction was completed in mid-September, the new playground opened to the public just in time for the school holidays.

Many hundreds of children returned to play on the restored rocket play piece and surrounding equipment. An official opening event also took place on 16 October, with the local community gathering to celebrate completion of the redevelopment. The event involved speeches, counting down to the cutting of the ribbon, and a face painter for children to enjoy.
