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Y Street building set to reopen

If you walk along Y Street, Ashburton, you might have noticed a freshly landscaped front yard at Number 4. The Y Street Community Services building, home to Camcare, has recently been renovated as part of our building renewal program.

The building upgrade involved both internal and external works, including refurbishments, updated heating and cooling systems, roof restoration works, a fresh backyard with a new pergola, paving and landscaping, and a newly paved front garden with benches for community members to use.

Previously an administrative base for Camcare, when they reopen in July the team will also be seeing clients at the building, including using the beautiful new outdoor spaces for meetings. The refurbishment will allow Camcare to provide a range of services to the Ashburton community, currently offered at its Camberwell site.

We look forward to seeing this welcoming space being used and enjoyed by both Camcare staff and their clients as a place to meet, connect, participate in activities and belong.

Solway resident Jennie Easson is President of the Camberwell Lacrosse Club, having previously held the positions of Secretary and Vice President for almost 20 years.

Jennie's son started playing lacrosse as a junior and she was quickly captivated by the skilled and fast-moving nature of the sport. She also found in the club a welcoming and friendly new community.

"The most enjoyable part of the job is communicating with and mixing with the club members and supporters and members of other clubs in the lacrosse community," says Jennie.

Her role requires excellent organisational skills to ensure the club can support its teams, coaches, officials and other volunteers. She has learnt about everything from Council compliance, social media and budgeting to state and

national sporting trends and policies, as well as lacrosse sticks and protective equipment. Jennie has also become an accredited official of both men's and women's lacrosse.

She says her volunteer role with the club is "such an enjoyable part of my life"... I feel that I have learnt more and had more enjoyment than I have put in."

Jennie encourages others in the community who are considering volunteering to give it a go.

Planting trees to reduce our emissions

We planted around 2,000 new trees in Boroondara in the 2022-23 financial year. This included the 1,000 trees we commit to planting every year, as well as an additional 1,000 trees we promised to plant in the last financial year as an action of our Climate Action Plan.

Here in Solway Ward and surrounds, this included:

- around 110 new trees in Ashburton
- around 180 new trees in Glen Iris
- around 200 new trees in Camberwell.

Young trees, whether planted on your nature strip by Council, or in your own backyard, will always benefit from a little extra attention.

Water it: We water new trees in public spaces to help them get established. However, pouring an extra bucket of water around young and mature trees once a week during the warmer months will help keep them healthy. To check whether your new trees need watering, feel the soil just below the layer of mulch – if it's dry, the tree should be watered.

Mind the bark: When mowing and using line trimmers, avoid contact with a tree's bark. Bark helps protect trees from pests and diseases, and damaging it can cause serious harm.

Winter wanders in Solway Ward

If you're in need of some fresh winter's air, why not enjoy one of our wonderful walks, parks or paths here in Solway Ward?

We're spoilt for choice when it comes to shared walking and riding paths – you can warm up by strolling or spinning along the accessible Gardiners Creek and Anniversary trails, or venture through bushland down the Ferndale Trail.

Skateboarders are also in luck as Solway Ward is home to 2 skate parks – one at Hill 'n' Dale Park in Glen Iris, and another at Ashburton's Markham Reserve.

Hill 'n' Dale Park (pictured below) connects to Summerhill Park via the Ferndale Trail. Warm yourself up here with a coffee on one of the park benches while the kids explore the mini maze and fenced sand area, climbing frames and slides.

Along with its skate park, public toilet and accessible facilities, Markham Reserve has an adventure park with climbing nets, a flying fox, monkey bars and a sandpit.

Do you have furry family members to keep entertained? You'll find off-leash parks at Ashburton Park, Hartwell Sportsground, Hill 'n' Dale Park, Markham Reserve, Summerhill Park and Warner Reserve.
