Brenton's our Citizen of the Year

On 26 January we gathered at Hawthorn Arts Centre to celebrate the Boroondara Citizen of the Year awards for 2024. Maranoa Ward's Brenton Ponza was named Boroondara Citizen of the Year.

Brenton was recognised for his disability advocacy and work as a volunteer coach at GoZone Gymnastics in Balwyn in particular. GoZone is a therapeutic gymnastics program for children with physical or intellectual disabilities.

Diagnosed with cerebral palsy, Brenton joined the GoZone program at 8 years old. He says helping others is what motivates him.

'When I was younger, I went to special needs gymnastics and this helped me lots. Now I am helping the group that helped me,' says Brenton. 'I love working as a team, making new friends and having a good chat.'

Aiming to spread awareness and raise much-needed funds, Brenton is also an

adviser for the Cerebral Palsy Education Centre. His dream for the future is for greater diversity and inclusivity in sport.

At the presentation ceremony, Brenton encouraged others thinking of volunteering to 'just do it'.

'People with a disability should give it a go. Try new things and give it a go because if you do not give it a go, you will never know what it is like,' he says.

The Boroondara Citizen of the Year Awards recognise people who have made an exceptional contribution to our community through leadership or commitment to improving the lives of others. Nominations for the 2025 Boroondara Citizen of the Year Awards will open in September.

A place for you right in your neighbourhood

Each year, Neighbourhood House Week in May is a timely reminder of our 11 neighbourhood houses and community centres in Boroondara and what they offer for all of us.

We are lucky to have 2 just on the doorstep of Maranoa Ward:

Trentwood at the Hub (trentwood.org. au) at Greythorn Community Hub in Balwyn North is Boroondara's newest neighbourhood house. It has recently opened a free exhibition space for local groups to share their stories and local artists to exhibit their works. The first exhibition is now running until the end of May, featuring photos from the Deepdene U3A Photography Group documenting Koonung Creek Reserve.

Balwyn Community Centre (balwyncc. org.au) – pictured below – has been upgraded recently and has new spacious, well-lit rooms, an outdoor leisure area, and is surrounded by bushy wetlands.

Both locations offer a mix of free and lowcost programs, classes and events, along with groups to join for fun and to connect you with others.

Post-war homes in bid for heritage protection

In 2022, we identified 18 properties in Balwyn and Balwyn North as worthy of heritage protection. With striking architecture, impressive design, or connection to the postwar development era, our heritage consultants considered these houses to be significant.

To protect the properties, we propose an amendment to the Boroondara Planning Scheme to include them in the Heritage Overlay.

The proposal was shared with the community for feedback in November and December last year. It outlined the properties and the details of their historical significance, including 22 Riverview Road, Balwyn North.

This attic-storeyed cream brick house was built in 2 stages, 1949 and then 1952. It combines 2 very different design styles – Moderne and Old English – that are rarely seen together.

With impeccable attention to design detail, the house is an example of the work of designer/builder Frances John Sanders.

In May, the amendment will be considered by an independent planning panel. In this public hearing, feedback received in submissions will be considered.

When we created the Boroondara Community Plan 2021–31, our community told us they value local heritage. It's Council's responsibility to help protect the character of our neighbourhoods. A Heritage Overlay helps ensure a property's social, aesthetic and historical value is considered if it's proposed for development.

Sports award nominations open

Nominations are now open for the 2024 Boroondara Sports Awards. It's a great opportunity to shout out a fantastic local sports player, club member or sports club here in Maranoa Ward by nominating them under a range of categories.

Last year, Hannah Lowe of local Titans Junior Basketball Club was named Club Person of the Year at the 2023 Sports Awards. She was recognised for her significant contributions to the Titans, where she is general manager and head coach.

Her nominator said Hannah has supported young people to pursue their love of basketball by coaching, training, creating programs, and advocating for her teams. She took over the Titans administration in 2006 when it had 19 teams and built it up to 217 community-level teams competing year round at local venues.

Nominations for the 2024 awards are open until Friday 17 May. Winners will be celebrated at a presentation evening in August.
