Thank you for your feedback on the design for the new playground at Kellett Reserve, our landscape architects are now reviewing your feedback to finalise the design, which we'll share in mid-2024.

I was pleased to meet with the parent committee at the JJ McMahon Memorial Kindergarten (pictured above) to discuss their vision for renewal. It is exciting to see that work has now begun on the project. I thank the teaching staff, parent volunteer committee, families and students for their patience during the temporary relocation and works.

The Victorian Electoral Commission is currently reviewing the ward boundaries across Boroondara and a preliminary

report has now been released. Changes will apply to the next Council election in October.

As the summer cricket season wraps up, congratulations to the great clubs across Cotham Ward, including the Deeners winning the MacGibbon Shield, the Bears winning the inaugural Sturgess Cup, and Kew Cricket Club into the final at the time this newsletter goes to print.

We now head into the winter season and many local clubs are keen to attract new members. These include Boroondara Eagles and Kew Rovers, offering a fantastic girls' footy program. Local sports clubs are a great way to build our sense of community.

Update on kindergarten renewal

Construction has started as we work to renew JJ McMahon Memorial Kindergarten in Kew.

Council officers worked closely with the kindergarten's committee of management and staff to develop a design for a high-quality early childhood education facility for our local community. Key features include:

- rebuilding the front playroom
- refurbishing the rear playroom
- a larger office to support the teaching team for planning
- a combined staff and meeting room with a kitchen
- a new shared children's bathroom between the playrooms.

Construction works are expected to be completed by late 2024, ready for the 2025 kindergarten year. Families can apply for the 3 and 4-year-old kindergarten program through the kindergarten central registration scheme.

Deepdene Bears Cricket Club and volunteer James Paterson were among Cotham Ward recipients recognised at the 2023 Sports Awards.

The Bears took home the Innovative Club of the Year Award. The club hosted 'The Big 6' for junior players last year at Stradbroke Park.

Among other activities, each child was given 6 chances to hit the ball as far as they could, hence the event name. It was a big success with a great atmosphere and all the children learning new skills.

James Paterson of Deepdene Bears Cricket Club was recognised with a

Lifetime Achievement Award. He has been a long-serving member of the committee, starting in the early 1980s on the committee of North Kew Cricket Club. After a club merger, he went on to become secretary of Deepdene Bears Cricket Club for 22 seasons and president for 4 seasons.

James was awarded the President's Award 3 times. This is given by the Club President to the person on the committee who is the hardest working and most dedicated for that season. In 1999, James was awarded Life Membership of the Deepdene Bears Cricket Club.

Nominations for the 2024 awards are open until Friday 17 May. Winners will be celebrated at a presentation evening in August.

Police home security tips

Most burglaries are opportunistic. This means there is much we can do to deter criminals looking for an easy target.

Victoria Police offers the following tips to keep you and your property safe.

- Lock all access points including internal and external garage doors, windows, gates, sheds, pet doors and skylights.
- Remove any spare keys hidden outside your home. Don't leave keys in window locks.
- Install deadlocks on all external doors and windows.
- Leave out a dog bowl or lead, even if you don't have a dog.
- Don't leave items at your door that might attract thieves.
- Install a peephole (door viewer) to see who is at the door.
- If someone knocks on the door, make a noise to show you're inside.
- Keep tools and ladders locked away so they can't be used to access your home.
- Consider installing a security screen door, monitored alarm system, cameras and sensor lighting.

Our top tips for off-lead etiquette

Dogs and their owners are well catered for in Cotham Ward, with 6 off-lead dog parks to choose from. You'll find them in Macleay Park, Belmont Park, Rathmines Road Reserve, Reservoir Reserve, Stradbroke Park and the Outer Circle Linear Park.

We all have a part to play in ensuring our parks and shared areas are welcoming and safe for everyone.

Being a responsible dog owner means more than just giving your pet what it needs, it's also about how you manage your dog around other people and animals and in our public spaces.

Try these tips for your next off-lead adventure:

- Carry dog-waste bags with you and use them.
 - Keep your dog 30 m from in-use barbecues or picnic areas, public meetings or sporting events and 10 m from the perimeter of a playground.
- All cats and dogs over 3 months old must be registered with Council by **Tuesday 9 April**. If you've recently moved, you can update your contact details, or let us know if your pet is no longer with you.
